Statement from Faculty Council in Support of our LGBTQIA+ Colleagues and Students

While it is always important and necessary to ensure policies, procedures, and practices that promote and ensure a sense of belonging for all members of our community, regardless of current events or climates, it is particularly important to emphasize this now in light of anti-trans legislation and incidents of hate and violence throughout the country, as well as the politicized attacks on public education and academic freedom. As such, in solidarity with members of our LGBTQIA+ community, the Faculty Council of the MCC Faculty Association unequivocally affirms its unwavering support of our LGBTQIA+ students, employees, and broader community and reaffirms our commitment to defend academic freedom and prohibit discrimination. We will work to ensure that MCC is a safe and inclusive environment for all students and employees.

- Faculty Council would like to strongly encourage our colleagues at every level to share their pronouns on zoom and in their email signatures.
- Faculty Council encourages inclusive written language, avoiding gendered language, in internal communications, personal notes and emails, announcements, forms, surveys, job ads, and so forth. This includes using "they/their/them" as standard practice for pronoun usage.
- Faculty Council encourages, as standard practice, that name tags at events will display correct pronouns listed when name tags are preprinted.

What Does It Mean to Be a Member of Faculty Council?

Faculty Council is the governing body of the FA. According to our FA By-Laws and Constitution, Faculty Council carries on the general business and formulates the policies of the FA, approves the budget and dues structure for submission to the members, appoints the Negotiating Team, authorizes decisions to proceed to arbitration, communicates with the general membership through the Faculty Association Newsletter (FAN), website, and email, appoints ad hoc committees, receive all reports and reviews all policy recommendations of committees, takes action on recommendations brought by the membership, holds regular meetings which are publicized and open to all Faculty Association members, and reports on negotiations to the general membership. Faculty Council officers are elected to two-year terms and meet bi-weekly on Wednesday afternoons during both the fall and spring semesters.

Members of Faculty Council serve as representatives of the general FA membership. The two Teaching Directors are the liaisons of teaching faculty, and the two Professional Staff Directors are the liaisons for the professional staff. Adjunct members are represented by both the Adjunct Director and the Adjunct Chair, who serves as the chair of the Adjunct Committee. Additional committee chairs include the Membership Chair, the Legislative Chair, and the Communications Chair. The Membership Chair is responsible for coordinating member outreach and engagement, the Communications Chair is responsible for assisting with membership communications (FAN, FA website & social media), and the Legislative Chair coordinates the Legislative Committee's endorsement process, lobbying for community college funding, and other local political efforts. The Diversity & Inclusion Director serves as a liaison between the FA and other campus DEI efforts and committees. The Health & Safety Director has a similar liaison responsibility related to health and safety issues on campus. The Site Directors serve as representatives of the FA membership at the downtown campus, Applied Technology center, and PSTF. The Grievance Officer coordinates grievance and arbitration efforts and serves as a member of the Executive Committee. Other members of the Executive Committee include the Secretary/Treasurer and the Vice Presidents for Teaching Faculty and Professional Staff. All Faculty Council members are knowledgeable about the contract and can provide general information and guidance to FA members.

Additional information about the roles and responsibilities of the FA officers and Faculty Council leaders can be found in the FA By-Laws.

What Does the Contract Say About Commencement?

Honors convocation and commencement are listed in Section J of Article 47: Workload for Teaching Faculty. Teaching faculty are contractually required to attend both convocation and commencement. If absent, teaching faculty are expected to use sick or personal time for these events.

Professional staff, however, are NOT contractually required to attend these events. Although professional staff are welcomed and encouraged to attend in support of our students, if absent, professional staff do NOT need to use personal, vacation, or sick time for these events.

Both convocation and commencement will be wonderful opportunities to celebrate the many accomplishments of our students. They are also opportunities to acknowledge and appreciate the work of FA members and MCC employees. Thank you to all MCC employees who work in some way to support or coordinate these events and thank you all for the work you do every day to support our students!
